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Introduction to Spellings Correction

Spellings Correction questions test your ability to identify and correct misspelled words. These questions evaluate your vocabulary, attention to detail, and knowledge of English spelling rules.

Typical SSC CGL Spellings Pattern:

Format 1: Identify the misspelled word in a sentence

Format 2: Choose the correctly spelled word from options

Format 3: Find the error in spelling in a given word

Skills Tested: Vocabulary, spelling rules, attention to detail

Common Question Types:

Type 1: Find the misspelled word

Example: Which of the following words is spelled incorrectly?

Type 2: Choose the correct spelling

Example: Choose the correctly spelled word from the options.

Approach to Spellings Correction:

- 1 Read the word carefully, syllable by syllable
- 2 Recall common spelling rules and patterns
- 3 Check for common error patterns (ie/ei, double letters, etc.)
- 4 Eliminate obviously wrong options
- 5 Verify your choice by mentally spelling the word

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Important Spelling Rules

1. "i before e" Rule

Rule: i before e, except after c, or when sounded as "a" as in neighbor and weigh.

i before e

believe chief

field

piece

Except after c

receive

deceive

ceiling

conceive

Sounded as "a"

neighbor

weigh

eight

vein

2. Doubling Final Consonants

Rule: Double the final consonant when adding a suffix if the word has one syllable, one vowel, and ends with one consonant.

Base Word	With Suffix	Rule Applied
run	running	One syllable, one vowel, ends with consonant
hop	hopping	One syllable, one vowel, ends with consonant
open	opening	Two syllables - no doubling
read	reading	Ends with two vowels - no doubling

3. Silent Letters

Many English words contain silent letters that are often misspelled.

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Word	Common Misspelling	Remember
knowledge	knowlege	Silent 'd'
Wednesday	Wensday	Silent 'd'
psychology	sycology	Silent 'p'
mnemonic	nemonic	Silent 'm'
receipt	reciept	Silent 'p'

4. Adding Suffixes

Rules for adding common suffixes like -ing, -ed, -er, -est.

Words ending in 'e'

hope → hoping

love → loving

make → making

Words ending in 'y'

happy → happiness

carry → carried

study → studying

Words ending in 'c'

panic → panicked

picnic → picnicking

traffic → trafficked

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Exam Tips for Spellings Correction

Time Management

Spend 20-30 seconds per spelling question. Don't overthink - often the correct spelling looks familiar.

Elimination Method

Eliminate options with obvious spelling errors first.

□ Common Patterns

Remember common spelling patterns and rules (ie/ei, double letters).

② Visual Memory

Trust your visual memory - the correct spelling usually "looks right."

Common Mistakes to Avoid:

- Confusing homophones (their/there/they're)
- Forgetting double letters in common words
- Missing silent letters
- Incorrect vowel sequences (ie/ei)
- Adding or omitting suffixes incorrectly
- Not verifying the word by reading it completely

Necessary (one c, two s's)

Separate (there's 'a rat')

Privilege (no 'd' after 'i')
